The Dallas Morning News February 22 issue featured a story about the 70th anniversary of realty firm Century 21 Judge Fite Co. The firm was founded in Oak Cliff by Sunset grad Judge B. Fite ('33). In 1975 the firm came under the management of son Jim Fite ('71), president, and daughter Jan Fite Miller ('65), executive vice president. In 1977, Judge Fite Co. signed on with Century 21. In addition to its longstanding Oak Cliff presence, the firm has offices all over the metroplex. It is now the #1 Century 21 company in Texas.

Sympathy is extended to the family of Martha Niendorff Gilmore ('53) upon her death in late June. She taught in Dallas ISD and in the Dallas County Jail, and entered the ministry in a desire to help people solve their problems. During her time in seminary she served as a Methodist Hospital chaplain. In 1977, Martha was the first woman in Dallas to be ordained into the ministry of a Southern Baptist church. She later transferred her orders to the United Methodist Church and served two Methodist churches (including Kessler Park United Methodist in Oak Cliff), and on the SMU staff. She received the Oak Cliff Lions Club Humanitarian Award in 2001.

The Sunset Academic Decathlon Team had a record year, achieving a new school record at Region X competition. Senior **Jonathan Vines** earned a silver medal in Language and Literature competition, and senior **Leonel Garcia** earned bronze in Art.

The Bison team was the highest-scoring DISD team in its division...Eight Sunset Choir students qualified for State Solo/Ensemble competition...Four of Sunset's Marketing students, under sponsor **Dan Madden**, participated in District DECA competition in Corpus Christi. The DECA Community Service Project making improvements to the student plaza was selected as a District winner.

Students, faculty and staff celebrated the 10th anniversary of "Read Across America" as they read and discussed issues of the day...The **College Board** ranked Sunset No. 1 in the nation for having the most students take and pass the **AP Spanish language test** in 2006. Last year, 268 Sunset students took the test and 194 passed.

& Alumni Voices...

Bison **Jerry Cobb** was Co-Captain of the 1957 basketball team that many regarded as the best team in the State. His widow Sharon wrote that Jerry "never forgot the glory days at Sunset. He loved the crowd, the attention, and said those were the best years of his life...His Sunset days were filled with friends, Sivils, cruising, and, most of all, basketball."

On April 28, members of the classes of 1951 and 1952 presented Sunset principal Tony Tovar with the Ivan Greenhaw Scholar-Athlete Trophy Award and memorial plaque. Mr. Greenhaw was a standout athlete at Sunset who served as president of the classes until his death in 2006. Beginning in 2008, the trophy will be presented annually to the Outstanding Scholar Athlete. The award is a sundial standing 11-1/2" high, mounted on a walnut base bearing brass plaques for engraving the recipient's name each year. Greenhaw's widow Margie Greenhaw, son David, and daughter Sally Abbott attended the presentation.

Ruth Jasper McGuckin (1944) was talking with a friend and mentioned that she was going to be attending a reunion of the Sunset High Class of 1944. The friend asked if she meant Sunset High of Dallas. Ruth was surprised because the friend grew up in Houston, and asked him how he knew of Sunset in Dallas. He told her anyone who played high school sports in Texas in the early 40's knew about Sunset, because it was "such a powerhouse in football, baseball, golf, track, basketball, and tennis."
