

Dr. JoGayle Dillon Howard – Class of 1969 JoGayle was born on May 20, 1951 in Dallas, TX to Roy J. Dillon and Katye M. Joplin and lived at 1623 Oak Knoll. After graduating in 1969, JoGayle married Steven Howard on June 12, 1969. She then graduated from Texas A & M with her veterinarian degree. In 1980, she went to work at the Smithsonian Zoological Park. A brilliant scientist and a pioneer of new techniques in reproduction and fertility earned her the nickname of "Sperm Queen".

JoGayle went on to receive her doctorate from the University of Maryland in 1989. Throughout her career she received numerous awards and

international acclaim for her innovative research, including the prestigious "Special Emphasis Research Career Award Fellowship" and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife "Recovery Champion".

"Her studies, along with Chinese and American colleagues, helped identify the causes of poor reproduction in giant pandas living in breeding centers and zoos, which then helped contribute to a panda population explosion over the past decade. With Chinese colleagues, she developed new protocols for sperm cryopreservation and artificial insemination. It was JoGayle who artificially inseminated the National Zoo's female panda, Mei Xiang, and produced the first surviving cub, Tai Shan, in 2005. But of the many species she studied, JoGayle was most interested in the secretive and beautiful clouded leopard of Southeast Asia. When the breeding program in North American zoos foundered, she established a research program in the range country of Thailand. She discovered the key to reproductive success was improved husbandry (including pairing animals at a young age), ensuring better nutrition, and providing more spacious enclosures. More than 50 cubs resulted, and JoGayle raised funds for the first-ever field studies of this elusive species. Although a Smithsonian research scientist, JoGayle had outstanding veterinary skills and constantly meshed her interest in reproduction with her knowledge of fostering physically and genetically healthy and disease free animals."

The Smithsonian Channel aired a special on JoGayle titled "Nature's Matchmaker" shortly after her death on March 5, 2011 in Washington, D.C. JoGayle's final resting place is at Laurel Land Cemetery, Section 5, Lot 52, Space 4.

New Sunset Field House

Named for the legendary Byron Rhome who coached at Sunset from 1936 to 1964. In 1936 he was coach for the Freshman Footabll and Track teams. He was named Head Coach in 1946 where he remained until 1964.

World War II Memoriam



2nd LT **Bobby John** Aderhold was born on February 21, 1924 in Dallas, TX to John Cotton Aderhold and Ethel Laird. He graduated from Sunset High in 1941 and was living at 2806 Burlington Avenue. Upon graduation Bobby attended Texas A & M before volunteering for service in the USMC. After winning his wings, he served from October 23, 1942 until his untimely death as an instructor for

student pilots. He received his commission as a 2nd Lt. on January 8, 1944. He was killed in an aviation accident near Jacksonville, Florida on April 25, 1944. He is buried at Laurel Land Cemetery in Oak Cliff, Section 39, Lot 169, Space 4, along with his parents and sister, Doris Ethyline Aderhold Koch, Class of 1940.



Bettye Jane Mims Danoff,

Class of '41



Bettye Danoff (May 21, 1923 – December 22, 2011) was an American professional golfer. She was one of the 13 founding members of the LPGA tour in 1950.

Born Bettye Jane Mims, she began playing golf at age 6. Her parents had opened a driving range and nine-hole golf course in Grand Prairie Texas. She also played under the

names Bettye Mims White and Bettye Mims Danoff.

The LPGA Tour wasn't founded until 1950. Before then, she won four straight Dallas Women's Golf Association Championships in addition to two Texas Women's Amateur Championship. In 1947, she defeated Babe Zaharias, 1 up, in the Texas Women's Open. Zaharias had won 17 consecutive tournaments before losing to Danoff. Also before her LPGA days, Danoff played exhibitions with PGA Tours stars.

Danoff was a mother to three daughters who traveled with her as she played off the LPGA Tour. After the death of her husband in 1961, Danoff played in a limited amount of tournaments. She was the LPGA Tour's first grandmother.

In the Class of '41, Bettye was the only female on Sunset's Golf team!

Danny Hall is Deputy Chief of Mission in Helsinki, Finland.

Hall, Class of 1970
joined the State
Department in 1989
after working as an
architect in New
Orleans, serving as a
Peace Corps Volunteer
in the Philippines, and
running his own small
business in the Dallas
Market Center. He has a

Masters in Architecture from Tulane University, and an MBA from Yale University.

Since joining the State Department, he has served in the Dominican Republic, Paris, Slovenia, Washington, the Provincial Reconstruction Team in Jalalabad Afghanistan, and London. He has won the Superior Honor Award five times, and the Meritorious Honor award five times. In 2007, he received the prestigious Arnie Raphel Award for mentoring in a ceremony in the Ben Franklin Room in the Department of State.

Danny grew up in Dallas, where his family has lived for several generations. However, he can trace his ancestors back to Lyman Hall, a signer of the Declaration of Independence as the representative from the state of Georgia, and a Yale graduate (241 years before Danny).
