# SPOTLIGHT... Monty Ousley Weddell



Monty attended Winnetka Elementary, Greiner Jr High and graduated from Sunset in 1962, while at Sunset he was involved in the Student Council, Tri-Sci Club and was a track letterman. He furthered his education at the University of North Texas. In 1965 he married the former Vicki Ellis (Class '66) and they have two children, Brad and DeAnna.

Monty was and still is very active (even though he claims to be retired!) as a business owner, community activist, and enjoys art, antiques, fossil collecting, archeology, paleontology, poetry, genealogy history. His most recent activities since retirement has been completing the largest volume of genealogical archival history ever published on his various families, which to date consists of 14 volumes and 7,000 pages.

He is the former AAU Mr. Dallas Bodybuilding Champion (M. Div. '87), a U.S.P.F. power lifting

champion, He is listed in "Who's Who" in two fields. He was also selected to TEAM USA in Powerlifting.

Artistically, Monty is influenced by several types of art. He usually expresses himself and his art through the use of form and color and most often is non-representational. He inherits the role of "next generation" of Abstract Expressionism as both an "action" and "color field" painter. His modernism wall sculptures are in wood, aluminum, and mixed mediums. His art works compare to Pollock, Motherwell, Still, Rothko, Krasner, Nevelson, Mondrian, and many others.

Monty's current project involves producing a series of original art works in acrylic, oil, pastels, aluminum and even concrete celebrating "Why We Fight", with individual works memorializing The Holocaust, Pearl Harbor, World Wars I & II, Korea, Viet Nam, Desert Storm, Iraq, and other subjects. Many of these art works are considered his most interesting and sometimes may be politically controversial.

Since the original establishment in 1972, Thee Art Gallery has showcased a wide selection of American contemporary art, artists, painters, and featured one of the widest varieties of quality popular fine art in numerous styles and mediums for individual collectors, art investors, museums, and corporate entities.

Monty was a Republican candidate to the Texas State Legislature three times. He also participated and consulted in dozens of candidates' campaigns and currently lectures on Political Science, which includes conservative philosophy.

### World War II Memoriam



Ensign Earl Roe Donell, Jr.
Class of 1934

#### Ensign Earl Roe Donell, Jr.

Earl was born on September 3, 1918 in Temple, Bell Co., Texas to Earl Roe Donnell, Sr and Ruth Lucretia Ayers, he had an older sister named Lucretia Ruth that graduated from Sunset in 1934. The family made their way to Dallas and settled at 1222 N. Winnetka where Earl's father owned and operated Donnell Ice Cream Co. that he started in his home. During high

school, Earl was involved in the ROTC, Rifle Team, Camp Dallas, Corporal Efficiency, Crack Team, Latin Club and the Ice Skating Club. After graduation, Earl went to the University of Texas where he received his Bachelor of Science degree in aeronautical engineering. It was during these years that he served in the U.S. Navy Reserve. He attended flight training in Pensacola, FL where he was awarded his pilot wings.

He was assigned to the Scouting Squadron #6 onboard the USS Enterprise. During an attack, flying a TBD-1, Bureau #0274, on the Marshall Islands, February 1, 1942, he was killed by heavy anti-aircraft fire as he attacked his assigned target. He was awarded the 'Air Medal for his service and the Purple Heart. In 1943, the U.S. Navy commissioned a ship in his honor the "USS Earl Roe Donnell, Jr" (DE-56) and named in his honor "The Donnell Navy Flying Squadron". His name is listed on the "Tablets of the Missing" National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific, Honolulu, Hawaii. There is, also a memorial marker at Restland Memorial Park in Dallas, TX.










# RANDOM LITTLE TIDBITS

### Mr. Handsome & Miss Beautiful

Did you know.... The Most Beautiful Girl and The Most Handsome Boy for the Class of 1954 was chosen by Desi Arnaz and Lucille Ball. The Co-Editors of the Sundial, Bettye Yancey and Corinne send photographs and asked the famous couple if they would select the two. They replied and chose Sandra Spring as the Most Beautiful and Charles Ervine as the Most Handsome. The runners-up were Barbara Cowherd and Jimmie McDougal.



Did you know in 1927 the following classes were offered at Sunset but no longer exist?

The Nutrition Class – the purpose of this class was to help girls who were eight or more pounds underweight to drink a cup of sweet milk or a cup of hot chocolate along with two graham crackers. It was reported that the average girl would gain 5 pounds within 18 weeks. Really? How about a hot fudge sundae every week instead?!

**Sunset Dippers** - the purpose of this class was to prepare the girls for passing the Life Saving Course and fifty-nine girls enrolled and went "dipping" every Tuesday and Thursday at the YWCA.

Hiking Squads – an emblem in the form of a Bison was awarded to the squad of ten girls who hiked the most miles. There were five squads with ten girls in each squad. The squad that won had hiked 116 miles in one day.

# HALL OF FAME

In 1950 Sunset selected Dr. Warren Travis White into the Hall of Fame for his outstanding accomplishments in education. Dr. White had been a principal at Sunset for ten years and in January, 1950 achieved national recognition as President of the American Association of School Administrators. While at Sunset he was known affectionately as "Papa" White. In 1964, he was honored with a new high school named in his honor, W. T. White High School in North Dallas. Dr. white passed away on November 3, 1987 at the age of 91.

# HISTORICAL DESIGNATION

We are very proud to announce that in addition to receiving our Dallas Historic Designation last year, the Texas State Historical Commission just approved a Subject Marker to commemorate the history of Sunset High School.
