World War II Memoriam



Class of 1932

Julius Emmet Ziegelmeyer Class of 1932

Julius Emmet Ziegelmeyer, Jr. was born in Dallas, TX on April 4, 1920 to Julius Emmet Ziegelmeyer and Carrie Belle Hardin. He was the only son and youngest child. He had an older sister named Penelope Lanell Ziegelmeyer who graduated from Sunset, Class of 1932.

Julius grew up in Oak Cliff and lived at 1046 N Edgefield (the house is

still there). While at Sunset, Julius was very active and was involved baseball,, was a member of the Tennis Club, Sodalitas Latina, Good Scholarship Club, Hundred Per Cent Banker, Non-Commissioned Officer in the R.O.T.C., Crack Company, Gymboree, Office Helper and was in the Thanksgiving Pageant.

The following was provided by the SigEp Patriots Project...{Second Lieutenant Ziegelmeyer made the ultimate sacrifice when he was killed in action over Germany while serving as a navigator aboard a B-17F (Flying Fortress) with the 324th Bomb Squadron, 91st Bombardment Group (Heavy) "The Ragged Irregulars", 8th Air Force.

After three years of college at the University of Texas, Julius enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corps as an aviation cadet in JAN 1942.

On 22 JUN 1943, aircraft 42-29998 departed RAF Bassingbourn as part of a mission against the synthetic rubber factory at Huls, Germany. According to the daily report for the 91st Bombardment Group, "Enemy air opposition was by far the worst yet experienced by this group, between 150 and 175 E/A attacked. Nearly all were FW-190 with a few ME-109's and two JU 88's reported. Encounters lasted one hour fifteen minutes and some crews reported as many as fifty attacks. Attacks from all sides. Flak at target was intense, accurate and a barrage type."

Second Lieutenant Ziegelmeyer and his crewmates crashed in Bungern, three miles SE of Bocholt, Germany. Julius and seven others were killed, and two of the Airmen were taken as POWs.

Julius was a brother of the Texas Alpha chapter of Sigma Phi Epsilon, and a member of the Class of '42 at UT. His awards include the Purple Heart & Air Medal.}

Our sincere appreciation to Ron Harris, Class '56 for his dedication to preserving the memory and the service of Sunset's WWII boys who gave their service and their lives.



Oak Cliff originated on Dec. 15, 1886 when John S. Armstrong and Thomas L. Marsalis bought a farm of 320 acres west of the Trinity River for \$8,000 and developed it into 20 acre blocks. The two partners split up and Armstrong went north and developed what is now Highland Park.
