Museum to display sports trophy restored by Sunset alumni

Alumni from Sunset, Adamson and four other Dallas high schools will gather Saturday morning at the Old Red Museum for an invitation-only unveiling of the Sanger Trophy at its new home.

From 1929 until the mid-1950s, the trophy was awarded annually to the high school with the year's best showing in athletic competition. Sunset won the award 12 times followed by Woodrow Wilson (8), Adamson (3), North Dallas and Crozier Tech (1 each) and Forest Avenue High (0). (BTW, a fine young tennis player, Roy Appleton Jr., helped Sunset bring the Sanger home in 1942 by winning the city doubles title his senior year.)

This from Don Martin, Sunset Class of 1952, who led efforts to restore the Sanger Trophy after it was found dented and missing parts at the school in 2001. Former Bisons ponied up some \$2,500 to return the trophy to its original look. And alumni from the six schools raised about \$4,000 to retrofit a case to hold the pedestaled trophy for permanent public display on the Old Red Museum's first floor. More here for subscribers.
