

Many wondered why this man at 41...would want to enter the war, his simple answer has been echoed through the ages "I could not ask these boys to join without going myself."

Sunset Principal, William Walter Bushman was born on April 23, 1901 in Missouri. He was married to the former Janice Yarbrough, also, a teacher with DISD. Their daughter, Billie Jan was born in 1941 and graduated from Sunset, Class of '58. He was much loved and much respected by students and faculty. Many wondered why this man at 41 with a small child would want to enter the war and his simple answer has been echoed through the ages "I could not ask these boys to join without going myself."

Major Bushman left his post as principal of Sunset HS and served in the US Army with the 312th Fighter Wing, 14th Air Force in the China Burma Theater of Operations. He died of unknown causes on August 23, 1944 at Kunming, China. Major Bushman is buried at the National Cemetery of the Pacific, Honolulu, Hawaii. He was the first and only faculty member at Sunset to die in WWII and was principal from 1941-1942 before entering the war.

His wife, Janice never remarried and lived at their home located at 2051 Marydale until her death in 1998. Their daughter Billie Jan Bushman Meade, "BJ" died in 1984.

Delmar "Buddy" Ham graduated in 1967 then spent the next 4 years in the Navy as an aircraft electronic tech. After his service (and we thank you for your service!) he worked for a steel company and attended ETSU where he obtained is BBA and completed his training for his pilot's license, all the while working 50 to 60 hours per week at the steel company.

In 1981 he left the steel company and began a construction company, Delmar Development Company, Inc. building ministorage facilities. He built facilities as a General Contractor in Texas, Virginia, Maryland and Delaware.

In 1988, while he was still building storage facilities when he began a new venture, Delmar Disposal Co., Inc. He started with 1 vacuum truck servicing grease and sand traps. Today, he has 15 vacuum trucks 14 employees and doing environmental evacuations and clean ups for all the major oil companies, Quik Trip, Race Trac, Exxon, Chevron, 7-11, Valero, Etc.

Last spring a friend from A&M visited and wanted him to invest in a new energy drink venture to compete with 5 hour energy. After many hours of research and testing they have come out with the new energy drink - Body Slam, with 3 flavors - wild berry, fruit punch and pomegranate.

Mission Statement


We exist to preserve Sunset's place as a significant educational and social place in northern and western Oak Cliff while recognizing achievements through its students, graduates, faculty and staff.

WORLD WAR II MEMORIAM



Lt. William Ormand Wisner was born on August 1, 1924 in Dallas, TX to Ralph and Ida McCue Wisner and grew up at 1619 Melbourne Avenue in Oak Cliff. He was a member of the ROTC at Sunset High School and after graduation in 1941 he attended North Texas Agricultural College in Arlington, TX. In March 1943, Billy completed his college prerequisites

for pilot training and his military career officially began.

He served with the 71st Fighter Squadron, 1st Fighter Group, XV Fighter Command, 15th Air Force stationed in Foggia, Italy. On October 20, 1944, while escorting a bomber stream to the oil storage facility in Regensburg, Germany. The 4 P-38's were hit by German flak. Two of the P-38's collided together and debris hit Billy's P-38 causing him to spiral out of control and nose dive. His place crashed somewhere near Bolzano, Italy. Billy was 20 years old.

Billy was reported "missing" then one year later was declared "presumed dead." 54 years later, Billy's niece, Diana Thompson Dale went on a two year search to find her missing uncle, an uncle who had died before she was born. Billy's remains were found buried near his crash site and positively identified by DNA. The local townspeople had buried Billy, but the wooden cross they had placed disappeared after all of these years. Through Diana's doggedly determination and the internet, she uncovered the mystery. Billy was finally brought home to Texas and was ceremoniously buried in the Veteran's Section II at Laurel Land Cemetery in Dallas, TX on November 21, 2001. Billy was awarded the Purple Heart and Air Medal. Unfortunately, Ralph & Ida never knew that there only son's remains had been recovered as they had both died before the discovery. Diana Thompson Dale wrote the details and published her book in 2003 "Finding Billy: An Internet Odyssey." Sadly, Diana passed away in 2010 and her mother, Maxine Wisner Thompson, Billy's only sibling and older sister, passed away this year.

Again, our sincere gratitude to Ron Harris, Class '56, for his dedication and hard work on our WWII Boys and for sending me the book "Finding Billy."

Bison in the News...




Gordon Donald Gayle
(born September 13,
1917) is a retired United
States Marine Corps
brigadier general and
historian. He was born in
Tulsa, Oklahoma.
Gayle graduated from
Sunset High School, Dallas
Texas in 1934. Gayle
briefly enrolled at SMU
before transferring to

the U.S. Naval Academy.

He graduated from the academy on June 1, 1939 and received a commission in the U.S. Marine Corps as a

second lieutenant. Gayle served in WWII in the Battle of Guadalcanal, New Britain campaign and the Battle of Peleliu. He also served in the Korean War in the Battles of Inchon and Chosin Reservoir.

For his military service he received numerous awards including the Navy Cross,



Legion of Merit, Bronze Star and Purple Heart. He retired from the military in 1968. Among Gayle's other accomplishments, he is also a published author about his war experiences at Peleliu. Gayle currently resides in Virginia near his children.
